WHAT ABOUT BOULDERING?

38% are bouldering gyms

Bouldering gyms are steadily on the rise. Last year 71% of new gyms were bouldering gyms.

WHAT ABOUT SPEED?

11% have speed walls

At least 40 climbing gyms in North America have 15-meter speed walls. At least 11% of all climbing gyms have some form of speed climbing wall.

ARE CLIMBING GYMS SUCCESSFUL?

Yes! 93% stay open at least 5 years.

Climbing gyms have a remarkable success rate compared to other businesses in similar industries. From 1987 through 2018, 93% of new gyms across the U.S. and Canada stayed open at least five years.
